FOUR REASONS TO SUPPORT OUR CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

1.THE DENNIS C. WHITEMEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND The Dennis C. White Memorial Scholarship, named in honor of a decorated member of the Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity Inc., is awarded annually during our Father's Day Brunch to high school students in the Philadelphia area aspiring to attain a college degree. We encourage minorities, especially those who are in need of financial assistance, to apply. In the last two years alone, we have presented more than \$10,000 in scholarships to students in need and in 2022, with the help of our sponsors, we'd like to double the amount of our scholarship award.

Dennis White was a Life Member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., who taught vocational skills in the School District of Philadelphia for over thirty-two years. He served on the Executive Board of the Philadelphia Federation of Teachers and was an advocate for students in the vocational programs across the city. He was also a Life Member of the Veterans of Foreign War and testified numerous times on legislation beneficial to Veterans and their dependents. His mission was to teach students a vocation in disciplinary schools such as O.V. Cato and Daniel Boone and to see those same students later owning their own businesses or serving in elected office. His legacy lives on through this scholarship.

2. SIGMA BETA CLUB (YOUTH MENTORSHIP PROGRAM) The Sigma Beta Club (SBC) is a traditional mentoring program for young men ages 8-18. For decades, SBC Philly has created safe spaces for young men to explore, to question, and to grow to become influencers in our communities. In 2015, SBC Philly was formally renamed the Darryl L. Coates' Sigma Beta Club of Philadelphia in memory of Mr. Darryl L. Coates, a past President of the Nu Sigma Chapter who served as the first International Sigma Beta Club Coordinator, founder of Nu Sigma Youth Services, and former Executive Director of the Philadelphia Anti-Drug/Anti-Violence Network (PAAN). He is credited with implementing and sustaining the SBC in Philadelphia circa 1989.

3.THE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT FUND The Nu Sigma Chapter works in collaboration with local schools, church groups, and other organizations throughout Philadelphia on special interest projects that address issues impacting the well-being of people in our community. The fund supports programs like our Adopt-A-School initiative, where annually we partner with Spruance Elementary School to provide mentorship, school supplies for students in need, holiday drives, and more. Similarly, since 2010 our Adopt-a-Highway program identifies streets in Philadelphia for our membership to come together to clean up, picking up trash and liter. Our deep roots and connections across the city provide our organization with countless opportunities to physically and financially support Philadelphia's communities and embrace our international motto: "Culture for Service, Service for Humanity."

4. SIGMA COMMUNITY CENTER The Nu Sigma Chapter is activity looking to purchase building space within Philadelphia to centralize our work within the community. Tentatively named the Sigma Community Center, the physical space would be funded by a new 501(c)(3) non-profit, the Nu Sigma Foundation and would host programming for the community. Collaborating with partner organizations, the Center will offer educational, wellness, and social activities to increase the wellbeing of the community. As an organization, we will be able to provide the appropriate and necessary tools for our community to collectively learn new skills that will improve our lives and the lives of others around us. In doing so, we believe that we will not only inspire positive change in the community, but that our collaborative efforts will bring a shared sense of respect, belonging, brotherly love, and service.



ORGANIZATIONAL PROFILE

Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity was founded at Howard University in Washington, D.C., January 9, 1914, by three young African American male students. The Founders, Honorable A. Langston Taylor, Honorable Leonard F. Morse, and Honorable Charles I. Brown, wanted to organize a Greek letter fraternity that would truly exemplify the ideals of Brotherhood, Scholarship, and Service. The Founders deeply wished to create an organization that viewed itself as "a part of" the general community rather than "apart from" the general community. They believed that each potential member should be judged by his own merits, rather than his family background or affluence without regard to race or nationality. They desired for their fraternity to exist as part of an even greater brotherhood which would be devoted to the "inclusive we" rather than the "exclusive we".

From its inception, the Founders also conceived Phi Beta Sigma as a mechanism to deliver services to the general community. Rather than gaining skills to be utilized exclusively for themselves and their immediate families, they held a deep conviction that they should return their newly acquired skills to the communities from which they had come. This deep conviction was mirrored in the Fraternity's motto, "Culture For Service and Service For Humanity". The Mission of the Fraternity is: To become the leading proactive community service organization focusing on issues that positively impact males in our communities.

The fraternity houses over 500 actives chapter around the world including our very own, Nu Sigma Chapter. *Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., Nu Sigma Chapter* was established in 1922 by the brothers of Epsilon Chapter, a city-wide undergraduate chapter chartered at Temple University. Both undergraduate and graduate brothers held membership in Epsilon Chapter until Nu Sigma, a graduate chapter, was chartered. All SIGMAS in the city met together, under the leadership of Epsilon Chapter until there were enough members to sustain independently a graduate chapter.



ORGANIZATIONAL PROFILE (cont.)

During this time, local SIGMAS, under the leadership on Epsilon Chapter President, Bro. Mallory S. Walker, hosted the 11th Anniversary National Conclave, the first for Pennsylvania, on December 27-31, 1924). For three years during the transition of graduate members from Epsilon to Nu Sigma, Bro. Dr. E. H. Barnes, a Frankford pharmacist, served as president of the graduate chapter.

Thursday evening, June 2, 1925, was the occasion of the election of the first full slate of graduate officers for Nu Sigma Chapter. The meeting was opened by president Bro. Dr. Barnes, who praised Epsilon Chapter for its leadership in establishing Nu Sigma. The brothers unanimously elected Bro. Dr. Thomas J. Potter president, replacing Bro. Dr. Barnes. Bro. Potter assumed office praising Dr. Barnes for his dynamic leadership over the past three years and assuring the members that "every ounce of energy" he possessed would be expended on behalf of their noble cause. Other officers elected upon this occasion were as follows: Vice President, Bro. Dr. George W. Evans; Corresponding Secretary, Bro. Dr. Raymond S. Bounds; Financial Secretary, Bro. William H. Jones; Treasurer, Bro. R. A. Bailey. Nu Sigma Chapter has continued from the beginning to carry the banner of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity in the city of Brotherly Love, hosting Regional Conferences in 1954, 1967, 1977, 1995 and 2002, 2021 and National Conclaves in 1941, 1961 and 2013.
